Establishing a Deaf/Blind Co-Navigation Services Program in the Office of the Deaf and Hard of Hearing, to provide co-navigation services at no cost to deaf/blind individuals in the State; and defining Co-Navigation Services as services providing visual and environmental information or sighted services to assist with communication accessibility in an individual's preferred language and communication mode, and to assist with accessing an individual's physical surroundings and making informed decisions about those surroundings.

• A policy of making co-navigation services free to the deaf/blind and hard of

hearing, also sets a good precedent for any future bills regarding accessible

technology.
