Testimony in Support of Senate Bill 502 – Property Tax - Credit for Law Enforcement Officer or Rescue Worker - Expansion to Judicial Officer

Chair Guzzone, Vice Chair Rosapepe, and Members of the B & T Committee,

This bill seeks to expand the current property tax credit available to all law enforcement officers and rescue workers to include judicial officers, as well as surviving spouses and cohabitants of judicial officers.
