Testimony in Support of House Bill 012

Chair Wilson, Vice Chair Crosby, and distinguished members of the House Economic Matters Committee:

The Office of Social Equity respectfully submits this testimony in support of House Bill 012 – *Cannabis - Sale and Distribution - Tetrahydrocannabinol Offenses*.

The Alcohol, Tobacco, and Cannabis Commission plays a vital role in safeguarding the integrity of Maryland's adult-use cannabis market. House Bill 012 strengthens the Commission's ability to enforce regulations against unlicensed and unregulated cannabis activity, ensuring that current operators and social equity licensees in the process of building their businesses are not undermined by misleading products that may pose risks to public health and safety.

This bill provides the Alcohol Tobacco and Cannabis Commission officers with expanded enforcement tools, such as the authority to issue citations and confiscate unlawful cannabis products. It also establishes clear standards for product potency, labeling, and advertising, incorporating provisions that align with the Maryland Cannabis Administration's laws on packaging and labeling. By addressing these issues, the legislation will create a more equitable, transparent, and responsible cannabis marketplace in Maryland.

I urge the committee to give this bill a favorable report, as it is a critical step in upholding the integrity of Maryland's nascent adult use market while protecting consumers and supporting compliant businesses.
