Dear Chair Feldman, Vice Chair Kagan, and Members of the Committee:

The Maryland Psychological Association (MPA), which represents over 1,000 doctoral-level psychologists throughout the state, is writing in SUPPORT of Senate Bill 68 - Public Schools - Restorative Practices Schools – Comprehensive Plan, which will expand the capability of local school systems to implement restorative practices and thereby better support student accountability for behavior through community social connections and improved relationships between individuals.

Enabling schools to become "Restorative Practices Schools" as defined in the bill will support positive classroom environments and result in decreases in achievement gaps for students with disciplinary issues, absenteeism, and related challenges. The restorative practices approach deals holistically with student behavior by handling behavioral incidents as they arise along with increasing social and emotional skills in students and staff. Thus, conflict and disruptions are reduced and marginalized students are more likely to succeed. We urge that SB 68 receive a favorable report.
