First, thank you for your service to the Maryland public on policy and legal issues that impact us the most, especially on matters of education, energy and the environment.

I am writing in support of SB524, a bill to permit religious institutions that received an exemption from the Maryland Higher Education Commission before January 1, 2013, when the state legislature changed the requirements for religious exempt institutions who are accredited. The change nullified religious exemption for accredited institutions and required the institutions to seek state certification.
