## TESTIMONY

- **Bill:** SB 871 Department of the Environment Community Water and Sewerage Systems Cybersecurity Planning and Assessments

## **Reason for Position:**

The Maryland Municipal League (MML) was originally opposed to SB 871 as it was introduced. The new amendments, however, make us more comfortable with the current bill language. The League understands and appreciates the goals of this legislation. Between various educational workshops and new partnerships, we have sought to improve the overall defense and readiness of local systems.

That said, local water and sewage systems are likely to incur increased costs to meet the bill's requirements. These costs could be significant depending on the system's size, the current cybersecurity measures in place, and the standards set forth in regulation. Our partners have advised that zero-trust frameworks can be particularly costly. This bill also requires ongoing maturity assessments of our systems.
