The St. Mary's County Alcohol Beverage Board met on November 14, 2024, and addressed the request of the St. Mary's County Department of Economic Development to provide support of pending draft legislation pertaining to the Annotated Code of Maryland, Alcoholic Beverages and Cannabis Article, allowing a person to hold a maximum of three Class B restaurant licenses. Good Afternoon Chair Beidle and members of the Senate Finance Committee:

The purpose of the bill is to authorize the Board of License Commissioners for St. Mary's County to issue a maximum than three (3) Class B beer, wine, and liquor licenses to an individual, while prohibiting a license holder from having a direct or indirect interest in more than one (1) of Class B beer, wine, and liquor license for the sale of off-premises consumption. Current St. Mary's County law only allows a person to hold one Class B restaurant license.
