**POSITION: Support as Amended**

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**TITLE:** Health Occupations Boards - Membership Alteration and Sunset Extensions

**BILL ANALYSIS:** The bill, when enacted, extends the termination of the statutory and regulatory authority of several Health Occupation Boards, including the Maryland Board of Professional Counselors and Therapists, until July 1, 2028. The bill also increases the number of board member positions of the State Board of Massage Therapy Examiners from seven to nine.

**POSITION AND RATIONALE:** The Maryland Board of Professional Counselors and Therapists (the “Board”) supports SB 217 as amended.

Health Occupation boards are mandated by the General Assembly to protect the public health, well-being, and safety of the citizens of Maryland. A favorable vote to extend the termination date ensures that the Maryland Board of Professional Counselors and Therapists continues to fulfill its mission and mandated responsibilities to credential, license, and certify qualified and competent counselors and therapists; investigate complaints; and discipline licensed and certified counselors and therapists found to have violated the Maryland Professional Counselors and Therapists Act.

For these reasons, the Maryland Board of Professional Counselors and Therapists respectfully requests a favorable vote on SB 217 as amended.
