Bill Number: Senate Bill 72 – Health Occupation Boards – English Proficiency Requirements

and Licensure by Endorsement for Nursing

The Maryland Assembly on School-Based Health Care (MASBHC) supports *Senate Bill 71 – Health Occupation Boards – English Proficiency Requirements and Licensure by Endorsement for Nursing.* The bill supports Maryland's efforts to address the nursing shortage including:

- Streamlining the licensure process for qualified nurses with unencumbered out-of-state licenses.
 For nurses who are already licensed in a Compact state, the bill would remove unnecessary paperwork and administrative burdens for licensure in Maryland; and
- Providing more flexible options for nurses to demonstrate English proficiency.

MASBHC is concerned about the impact of the nursing shortage of school-based health centers (SBHCs) and school health programs. The nursing shortage impacts the ability of SBHCs and school health programs to meet the needs of their students. A growing number of students have chronic diseases, as demonstrated by a finding of the Center for Disease Control and Prevention that 25% of children between the ages 2 and 8 have a chronic condition such as asthma or obesity. We support legislation that will help Maryland recruit and retain more people into nursing.
