

SENATE BILL 357: LOWERING PRESCRIPTION DRUG COSTS FOR ALL MARYLANDERS NOW ACT

POSITION: FAVORABLE

Chair Peña-Melnyk, Vice Chair Cullison, and Members of the Health and Government Operations Committee,

My name is James Reedy, and I am submitting this testimony in favor of SB0357 on behalf of Shore Progress. Shore Progress (formerly the Lower Shore Progressive Caucus) is a non-partisan civic organization covering the Eastern Shore of Maryland. We support this bill because it will provide instant relief for Marylanders suffering from overpriced prescription medication. I was diagnosed with a rare dermatological condition on December 31, 2024. After consulting with my dermatologist regarding pain that had persisted for months, it was determined that I needed a medication called Doxepin. Upon picking up the medicine, the pharmacy clerk informed me it would cost about \$700 since my health insurance would not cover the cost. I know that not every Marylander has that kind of money in savings, which eventually helped the pain subside.

We support this bill because it:

- 1. It Reduces Medical Debt: 100 million people in the United States live with medical debt. Here on the Eastern Shore, nearly 21-30% of residents in Dorchester & Wicomico County are living in medical debt, along with 31-40% of Somerset County residents. This bill aims to reduce this debt.
- 2. **It Provides Economic Stimulation:** When Marylanders are not spending money on prescription drug bills, it gives them the freedom to spend money elsewhere in the economy and within their local communities.

By making this a priority, you can give Marylanders the freedom to reduce their debt, participate more freely in the economy, and ensure no one is left behind from overpriced prescription drugs.

We support this bill and recommend a FAVORABLE report in committee.
