The Maryland Affiliate of the American College of Nurse Midwives (ACNM) supports Senate Bill 356 - Public Health - Prohibition on Transfer of Human Immunodeficiency Virus - Repeal. The bill will repeal the current misdemeanor (MD. CODE. ANN., HEALTH-GEN. § 18-601.1) that criminalizes the transmission or potential transmission of HIV.

The current law is stated in such a way that even breastfeeding a child or consensual sex using a barrier contraceptive can be interpreted as a criminal act. In 2025, the science of preventing and treating HIV renders this law both cruel and unnecessary. Medications for both pre- and post-exposure prophylaxis have transformed the risk equation in all settings, including perinatal exposure, sexual activity, and even needle-sharing. In addition, current treatment regimens for people living with HIV are highly effective at preserving health and preventing transmission.<sup>1</sup>
