Re: oppose Bill HB0161

To whom it may concern,

For example, strengthening communication between schools and families about health class curricula and ensuring alternative educational pathways for students whose parents opt out would be more constructive approaches.

I respectfully request that you oppose this bill (including any bill that prohibits parents opt-out) and support policies that uphold the rights of parents and guardians in the education of their children.
