Task Force on Responsible Use of Natural Psychedelic Substances

Dear Members of the Senate Finance Committee:

I support Senate Bill 0336, which would extend the Maryland Task Force on Responsible Use of Natural Psychedelic Substances through 2027 and require an updated report in 2026.

My name is David Jun Selleh. I am a resident of Montgomery County, District 9A. I am a Licensed Clinical Professional Counselor, offering Psychedelic Integration and Harm Reduction services and Ketamine-Assisted Psychotherapy (KAP): an integrative approach to leveraging non-ordinary states of consciousness to treat mental health conditions. I also sit on the Task Force on Responsible Use of Natural Psychedelic Substances, as one with expertise in psychedelic-assisted psychotherapy.

Natural psychedelic substances have been used for millenia in spiritual ceremonies. Despite present-day federal restriction and absence of FDA-approved options, clinical and public interest is surging. The FDA designated psilocybin a “breakthrough therapy.” The DoD is funding psychedelic research for military and veterans. Oregon, Colorado, and New Mexico have already enacted state-level regulated psychedelic access models, offering valuable lessons learned. Washington, D.C. decriminalized psychedelics, furthering a presently unmonitored market. The presidential administration has taken an assertive stance on advancing psychedelics, leaving Maryland with a time-limited opportunity to tailor local policies before federal standards are imposed.

In my professional counseling work, I have witnessed both irresponsible and responsible use of natural psychedelic substances, often driven by public interest in clinical findings, and ready access through Washington D.C. and other illicit channels. A regulated access program can maximize benefits while also mitigating risks for Marylanders already seeking these compounds.

The Task Force does not support delaying state action. As a pioneer in psychedelic science since the 1950s, Maryland is well-positioned to translate lessons from other states into a responsible resident-centered policy, leading national models rather than reacting to them. An extension will allow the Task Force to carefully craft a regulatory approach that ensures safe, responsible, and affordable access.

I urge the committee to vote favorably on Senate Bill 0336 and support the extended work of the Maryland Task Force on Responsible Use of Natural Psychedelic Substances.
