RE: **HB 410 - Public Health - Food and Milk Product Labeling - Requirements**

The Maryland Conference of Local Environmental Health Directors (Conference) **OPPOSE** HB 410 in their capacities as the State's twenty-four Environmental Health Directors responsible for carrying out activities covered by the delegated authorities from Maryland Department of Health (MDH).

The Conference believes this proposed legislation would create an unnecessary burden on small Maryland businesses and conflicts with existing Federal labeling laws.

Currently, Federal labeling laws permit the use of the term "sell-by" for packaged foods. HB 410 would eliminate this terminology after July 1, 2027. Furthermore, the bill would impose a significant financial burden on small businesses, requiring them to conduct laboratory testing to establish the date that ensures the product is safe for consumption.

Accordingly, the Conference requests the Committee give HB 410 an **UNFAVORABLE** report.
