The Maryland Governor's Office of the Deaf and Hard of Hearing (ODHH) respectfully submits this Letter of Support regarding the proposed extension of the Maryland Deaf, DeafBlind, and Hard of Hearing Workgroup.

The Workgroup was established to examine systemic barriers affecting Deaf, DeafBlind, and Hard of Hearing Marylanders in areas such as communication access, employment, healthcare, emergency preparedness, education, and interagency coordination. Through collaboration among State agencies, community organizations, and advocacy groups, the Workgroup has made meaningful progress in identifying service gaps and evaluating potential policy improvements.

ODHH supports extending the Workgroup to allow additional time for comprehensive data collection, stakeholder engagement, and development of thoughtful, actionable recommendations. Because many of the issues under review involve cross-agency coordination and long-term policy considerations, additional time will help ensure that further recommendations are well-developed, operationally feasible, and aligned with Maryland's fiscal and administrative framework.

An extension will strengthen the quality of the Workgroup's final report and provide the General Assembly with more complete, data-informed findings to guide future decision-making. ODHH appreciates the Committee's continued commitment to improving access and equity for Deaf,

DeafBlind, and Hard of Hearing Marylanders and respectfully urges favorable consideration of the Workgroup's extension.
