- 1 Section 1. Be It Enacted By The County Council of Harford County, Maryland that Section
- 2 64-20, Animals in vehicles, of Article IV, Animal Care; Abuse; Cruelty, be, and it is hereby,
- 3 repealed and reenacted, with amendments, all of Chapter 64, Animals, of the Harford County
- 4 Code, as amended, and all to read as follows:
- 5 Chapter 64. Animals
- 6 Article IV. Animal Care; Abuse; Cruelty
- 7 § 64-20. Animals in vehicles.
- 8 A. No person shall leave any animal unattended in a motor vehicle when the temperature
- 9 outside exceeds [80] 70° F., except the Sheriff, a state or local police K-9 officer who is
- 10 especially equipped with a vehicle that is used for animal transport. A POLICE K-9
- OFFICER, OR WITHIN ANY VEHICLE EQUIPPED WITH A SAFETY CLIMATE
- 12 CONTROL SYSTEM DESIGNED FOR ANIMAL TRANSPORT.
- 13 B. Any law enforcement officer or agent of the Humane Society of Harford County, Inc., who
- determines that an animal has been left in a motor vehicle in violation of this Article shall
- have the right to take such reasonable steps to free the animal from the vehicle as he deems
- necessary to protect the animal from serious injury or death.
