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## CHAPTER \_\_\_\_\_

1 AN ACT concerning

2 **Creation of a State Debt - Maryland Consolidated Capital Bond Loan of 2005**  
 3 **and the Maryland Consolidated Capital Bond Loans of 1998, 2000, 2002, 2003,**  
 4 **and 2004**

5 FOR the purpose of authorizing the creation of a State Debt in the amount of Six  
 6 Hundred Sixty-Five Million, ~~Three Hundred Thirty Five~~ Four Hundred  
 7 Forty-Three Thousand Dollars ~~(\$665,335,000)~~ (\$665,443,000) the proceeds to be  
 8 used for certain necessary building, construction, demolition, planning,  
 9 renovation, conversion, replacement, and capital equipment purchases of this  
 10 State, for acquiring certain real estate in connection therewith, and for grants to  
 11 certain subdivisions and other organizations for certain purposes, subject to the  
 12 requirement that certain grantees provide certain matching funds of a certain  
 13 type by a certain date; providing generally for the issuance and sale of bonds  
 14 evidencing the loan; *altering a provision of law to allow the Maryland Stadium*  
 15 *Authority to use certain funds for certain studies*; providing for certain  
 16 unexpended appropriations in prior capital budgets and bond loan acts to be  
 17 expended for other public projects; altering certain requirements for certain  
 18 programs in prior capital budget acts; providing that the authorizations of State  
 19 Debt in certain prior capital budgets and bond loan acts be reduced by certain  
 20 amounts; providing for certain additional information to be detailed about each  
 21 project in the capital program; repealing a requirement for a certain  
 22 appropriation; *altering the membership of the Capital Debt Affordability*  
 23 *Committee*; and generally relating to the financing of certain capital projects.

24 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF  
25 MARYLAND, That:

26 (1) The Board of Public Works may borrow money and incur indebtedness on  
27 behalf of the State of Maryland through a State loan to be known as the Maryland  
28 Consolidated Capital Bond Loan of 2005 in the total principal amount of ~~\$665,335,000~~  
29 \$665,443,000. This loan shall be evidenced by the issuance, sale, and delivery of State  
30 general obligation bonds authorized by a resolution of the Board of Public Works and  
31 issued, sold, and delivered in accordance with Sections 8-117 through 8-124 of the  
32 State Finance and Procurement Article and Article 31, Section 22 of the Code.

33 (2) The bonds to evidence this loan or installments of this loan may be sold as  
34 a single issue of bonds under Section 8-122 of the State Finance and Procurement  
35 Article.

36 (3) The cash proceeds of the sale of the bonds shall be paid to the Treasurer  
37 and first shall be applied to the payment of the expenses of issuing, selling, and  
38 delivering the bonds, unless funds for this purpose are otherwise provided, and then  
39 shall be credited on the books of the Comptroller and expended, on approval by the

 6 proceeds of a loan under this Act shall submit evidence satisfactory to the Board that  
 7 none of the proceeds of the loan or any matching funds has been or is being used for  
 8 a purpose prohibited by this Act.

9 SECTION ~~11.~~ 12. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That, the Comptroller  
 10 may advance funds to any loan funds account established pursuant to a general  
 11 obligation bond loan enabling Act, for any expenditure authorized by that Act,  
 12 provided that if general obligation bonds have not been issued under the authority of  
 13 that Act, the next ensuing sale of general obligation bonds shall include the issuance  
 14 of bonds under the authority of that Act in an amount at least equivalent to the  
 15 amount of the funds so advanced.
