The Secretary of Health and Mental Hygiene proposes to repeal in their entirety Regulations .01—.13 under COMAR 10.09.79 Psychiatric Residential Treatment Facility (PRTF) Demonstration Waiver.

Statement of Purpose

The purpose of this action is to repeal the entire Psychiatric Residential Treatment Facility (PRTF) Demonstration Waiver chapter because federal authority for the demonstration waiver has expired. A majority of the PRTF services are covered under 1915(i) Intensive Behavioral Health Services for Children and Youth.
