### **Agriculture, Department of**

Proposed Regulation DLS Control No. 19-296 Department of Agriculture: Soil and Water Conservation: Agricultural Operation Nutrient Management Plan Requirements: COMAR 15.20.07.01 through .08

According to the department, the purpose of this action is to:

- add a new definition under Regulation .03 defining the term "Annual Implementation Report";
- require a farm operator that uses or produces animal manure to file, by March 1 each year, the Annual Implementation Report that contains certain information;
- require the department to prioritize certain enforcement actions;
- impose certain administrative penalties against a farm operator who fails to implement or otherwise comply with a nutrient management plan that meets the requirements of this chapter;
- impose a certain administrative penalty against a farm operator who knowingly applies phosphorus to a field or management unit when such application is prohibited under department regulation;
- impose certain administrative penalties against a farm operator who fails to file the Annual Implementation Report in a timely manner after certain notification from the department; and
- generally relating to agricultural operator nutrient management plan requirements.

Proposed Regulations DLS Control No. 19-297 Department of Agriculture: Soil and Water Conservation: Nutrient Management Certification and Licensing: COMAR 15.20.04.05.13, and .14

According to the department, the purpose of this action is to:

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- authorize the Maryland Department of Agriculture to impose an administrative penalty, not exceeding \$250, against a person who holds a license or certificate to write nutrient management plans, if that person fails to meet certain reporting requirements and deadlines established by the department related to phosphorus; and
- correct a punctuation error in Regulations .05.

### Attorney General, Office of the

Proposed Regulations DLS Control No. 19-298 Office of the Attorney General: Sexual Assault Evidence Kits: Sexual Assault Victims' Rights – Disposal of Rape Kit Evidence and Notification: COMAR 02.08.01.03 through .05 Sexual Assault Evidence Collection Kits – Analysis: COMAR 02.08.02.01 through .05 Review of Law Enforcement Decisions Not to Test a Kit: COMAR 02.08.03.01 through .05 Reporting: COMAR 02.08.04.01 through .02

According to the office, the purpose of this action is to:

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- clarify the process for transferring sexual assault evidence collection kits from hospitals to law enforcement agencies and require that victims are notified of a law enforcement agency's decision not to test a kit should they request such a notification;
- identify the criteria for testing sexual assault evidence collection kits;
- establish procedures under which a person may request an independent review of a law enforcement agency's decision not to test a sexual assault evidence collection kit; and
- expand the reporting requirements for law enforcement agencies and forensic laboratories to ensure consistent statewide implementation of Ch. 33 (2019).
