Emergency/Proposed Regulations DLS Control No. 19-018 Department of Agriculture: Office of the Secretary:

Use of Antimicrobial Drugs: COMAR 15.01.15.02

According to the department, this regulation alters the definitions of "regular pattern" and "prophylaxis" that are included in existing regulations governing the use of medically important antimicrobial drugs in the production of cattle, swine, and poultry. The regulation also adds a definition of "elevated risk."

Thoroughbred Rules: COMAR 09.10.01.89

According to the department, the purpose of this action is to allow the thoroughbred tracks to offer a new type of bet called the Roulette wager. The track offering this type of wager will designate two or more horses in a race in a category of black, green or red. The patron shall select a color and if any of the horses designated as that color win, the patron will have a successful wager.

The commission indicates that this type of wager has been used in Florida and California on big event days. Because there are many individuals who attend the races for the first time on these big event days they do not have much handicapping experience. This wager provides a different method of selecting a winner and is being used as a marketing tool for Preakness week.

According to the department, the purpose of this action is to amend COMAR 11.03.01.09 to establish in COMAR a standard for the MDOT MAA to refuse, revoke, suspend, and confiscate an identification badge if MDOT MAA determines that an individual in possession of an identification badge poses a threats or potential threat to the health, safety or welfare of Airport property, personnel, passengers or customers. COMAR 11.03.01.01 is amended to define two phrases that are used within the proposed amendments to COMAR 11.03.01.09.

Proposed Regulations DLS Control No. 19-021 State Board of Education: Specific Subjects:

Gifted and Talented Education: COMAR 13A.04.07.01 through .04, and .06

According to the board, the purpose of this action is to provide local school systems with direction for identifying students and developing and implementing the gifted and talented education programs and services needed to develop these students' full potential. These regulations establish the minimum standards for student identification, programs and services, professional learning, and reporting requirements.
