According to the department, the purpose of this action is to clarify terms and provisions regarding the criteria and procedure for entering into a corrective easement on a farm subject to an agricultural land preservation easement held by the Maryland Agricultural Land Preservation Foundation. This action further serves to articulate the circumstances, and procedures, under which a landowner's routine application for a corrective easement on farmland already subject to an agricultural land preservation easement held by the Foundation can be approved administratively.

This will provide the Board of Directors for the Foundation with greater discretion in its consideration of reasonable and appropriate overlay easement requests.

Specifically, the purpose of this change is to promote efficiency by narrowing the list of required elements in the registry to ensure that compliance is not unduly burdensome, as compared with the necessity of obtaining the required information.
