FIREARM SAFETY ACT OF 2013

Altering the authorization for a person to wear, carry, or transport a handgun to be within specified limitations; designating specified firearms as assault weapons; prohibiting, with specified exceptions, a person from transporting an assault weapon into the State or possessing, selling, offering to sell, transferring, purchasing, or receiving an assault weapon; authorizing specified licensed firearms dealers to continue to possess, sell, offer for sale, or transfer specified assault weapons under specified circumstances; etc.

HB 295 The Speaker (By Request – Administration), et al**DEATH PENALTY REPEAL AND APPROPRIATION FROM SAVINGS
TO AID SURVIVORS OF HOMICIDE VICTIMS**

Repealing the death penalty; repealing procedures and requirements related to the death penalty; providing that in specified cases in which the State has filed a notice to seek a sentence of death, the notice shall be considered withdrawn and it shall be considered a notice to seek a sentence of life imprisonment without the possibility of parole under specified circumstances; providing that specified persons serving life sentences are not eligible for Patuxent Institution under specified circumstances; etc.

EVALUATION**

Continuing the State Amusement Ride Safety Advisory Board, the Occupational Safety and Health Advisory Board, the Apprenticeship and Training Council, and the Board of Boiler Rules in accordance with the provisions of the Maryland Program Evaluation Act (Sunset Law) by extending to July 1, 2024 the termination provisions relating to the statutory and regulatory authority of the boards and council; repealing the termination provision for the Division of Labor and Industry; etc.

Authorizing the creation of a State Debt not to exceed \$250,000, the proceeds to be used as a grant to the Board of Directors of the Dundalk Youth Services Center, Inc. for the planning, design, construction, repair, renovation, reconstruction, and capital equipping of the Dundalk Youth Services Arts Center, located in Baltimore County; providing for disbursement of the loan proceeds, subject to a requirement that the grantee provide and expend a matching fund; etc.

Altering the number and term of winery special event permits the Comptroller may issue to Class 4 Maryland limited wineries for use at specified farmers' markets in Carroll County; and authorizing the Comptroller to issue a winery special event permit for unlimited use for 1 day each week.

Authorizing the creation of a State Debt not to exceed \$100,000, the proceeds to be used as a grant to the Board of Directors of Residential Continuum, Inc. for the construction, repair, renovation, reconstruction, and capital equipping of RCI Group Home, located in Montgomery County; providing for disbursement of the loan proceeds, subject to a requirement that the grantee provide and expend a matching fund; etc.

Authorizing the State Comptroller to issue a Class 6 pub-brewery license to a holder of a specified alcoholic beverages license that is issued for use on the premises of a restaurant located in St. Mary's County.

Authorizing the medical use of marijuana under specified circumstances; repealing criminal provisions that allow the imposition of a fine or the use of an affirmative defense for use or possession of marijuana or use or possession of drug paraphernalia related to marijuana under specified circumstances; requiring the Department of Health and Mental Hygiene to adopt regulations on or before September 1, 2013; authorizing the Department to vary application and renewal fees along a sliding scale; requiring a specified annual report; etc.

Establishing the Task Force to Study Point–of–Care Testing for Lead Poisoning; providing for the composition, chair, and staffing of the Task Force; requiring the Task Force to study and make recommendations regarding the use of and reimbursement for point–of–care testing to screen and identify children with elevated blood–lead levels; requiring the Task Force to report its findings and recommendations to the Governor and specified legislative committees on or before January 1, 2014; etc.

Authorizing, subject to specified requirements, a person to place or maintain an advertising sign for specified agricultural businesses on a State highway; providing that specified provisions of law regulating the placement and maintenance of outdoor signs in specified locations do not apply to a sign placed in accordance with the Act; making stylistic changes; etc.

Prohibiting a person from engaging in the commercial rearing of shellfish seed outside specified leased areas without first obtaining a shellfish nursery permit from the Department of Natural Resources; placing limitations on the issuance and scope of a permit for land-based and in-water shellfish nursery operations; providing that specified water quality classifications and restrictions established by the Department of the Environment may not affect specified in-water shellfish nursery operations; etc.

HB 307 Carroll County Delegation**CARROLL COUNTY – MAINTENANCE OF EFFORT – ADJUSTMENT FOR DECREASING STUDENT ENROLLMENT**

Altering the required maintenance of effort appropriation that the county governing body of Carroll County must make to the school operating budget when there is a decrease in student enrollment under specified circumstances; providing for the effective date of specified provisions of the Act; and providing for the termination of specified provisions of the Act.

Authorizing a judgment creditor to obtain discovery in aid of enforcement of a money judgment entered or recorded in a circuit court or in the District Court by use of a court ordered examination under oath before a judge or examiner of a judgment debtor or any other person deemed by the court likely to possess or have knowledge of assets subject to execution; and establishing timing, notice, and procedural requirements for court ordered examinations in aid of enforcement of a money judgment.

Authorizing specified organizations in Carroll County to conduct a card game, card tournament, or casino night under specified circumstances; requiring an organization to obtain a permit from the Board of License Commissioners of Carroll County before conducting a card game, card tournament, or casino night; requiring an organization that seeks a permit to meet specified requirements; specifying that a card game, card tournament, or casino night may be managed and organized by specified organizations; etc.

Requiring, under specified circumstances, a parent or other person who has permanent care or custody or responsibility for the supervision of a minor under a specified age to notify, within a specified period of time, the appropriate law enforcement agency that the minor is a missing child; requiring, under specified circumstances, a specified person to notify, within a specified period of time, the appropriate law enforcement agency or medical authority that the minor has died; etc.

Requiring that specified licensees or employees of the licensees give immediate access to specified members or employees of the State Board of Morticians and Funeral Directors for purposes of conducting specified inspections; requiring the Board to provide the results of an inspection to specified licensees within 24 hours after completion of an inspection; etc.

Expanding the authority of the State Board of Morticians and Funeral Directors to discipline the holders of funeral establishment licenses under specified circumstances.

Prohibiting a landlord from using a lease containing a provision that requires a tenant to carry renter's insurance naming the landlord as beneficiary; restricting rental fee increases on specified residential rental units to 5% of the base rent; providing that a landlord may exceed the maximum rental fee increase authorized by the Act under specified circumstances; prohibiting a landlord renting four or more residential units from evicting a tenant in the absence of just cause; etc.

Prohibiting a person from violating the federal Children's Online Privacy Protection Act; prohibiting specified persons who engage in specified activities relating to the Internet or an online service from using specified information to display or transmit an advertisement for a product or service to specified children under specified circumstances; etc.

Declaring that it is the public policy of the State to restrict and deter the use of unauthorized alien workers in the performance of public contracts and grants in the State; specifying criteria for mandatory registration in a federal E-Verify program for specified contractors and grantees; prohibiting noncompliant persons or entities from performing specified contracts; imposing specified requirements on subcontractors; authorizing the Commissioner of Labor and Industry to assess penalties; etc.

Prohibiting an employer from requiring, as a condition of employment or continued employment, an employee or prospective employee to join or remain a member of a labor organization, pay charges to a labor organization, or pay a specified amount to a third party under specified circumstances; prohibiting an employer from threatening an employee or a prospective employee with specified action; providing that a specified violation of law is a misdemeanor and is subject to specified penalties; etc.

Adding a nonvoting student representative to the Carroll County Board of Education; requiring the student representative to meet specified qualifications; specifying the term of the student representative; requiring that the student representative advise the County Board on specified matters; prohibiting the student representative from attending an executive session of the County Board unless invited to attend by an affirmative vote by a majority of the County Board; specifying that only voting members may receive compensation; etc.

Authorizing an individual for whom special registration plates for individuals with disabilities are issued to park in a designated zone for the handicapped established by Baltimore County on any county road, subject to a restriction.

Requiring an election judge to establish a voter's identity and verify the voter's address if the voter seeks to vote a regular ballot; requiring an election judge to qualify a voter by requesting the voter to present a current government-issued photo identification; requiring an election judge to authorize an individual to vote a regular ballot; allowing a voter who is unable to present a specified form of identification to vote by provisional ballot under specified circumstances; etc.

Establishing a vulnerable adult abuse registry; requiring the Department of Health and Mental Hygiene to establish and maintain a registry containing the names of specified individuals; requiring that names and information contained in the registry be available for public inspection; authorizing the Department to discharge specified responsibilities in a specified manner; requiring a State agency that makes a specified finding to notify the Department in a specified manner; etc.

Requiring the State to authorize private sector development and maintenance of a data warehouse for private providers of health, education, and social services; authorizing a provider to store specified information in the data warehouse; prohibiting a provider from using the data warehouse for specified purposes; authorizing a provider to provide a State agency with necessary information to access documents in the data warehouse instead of submitting paper documents or electronic files; etc.

Altering the definition of “qualified Maryland biotechnology company” for purposes of the biotechnology investment tax credit to exclude a company that has received investments from specified qualified investors; repealing obsolete language; and applying the Act to initial tax credit certificates issued after June 30, 2013.

Requiring the Office of Student Financial Assistance to assist in the repayment of specified higher education loans owed by recipients of a Nancy Grasmick Teacher Award who receive specified degrees from specified institutions; altering a specified definition to authorize a specified student attending an institution of higher education outside the State to qualify for a Walter Sondheim Jr. Public Service Summer Internship Scholarship; and altering qualifications for eligibility for a specified scholarship.

Requiring that a public body take specified actions if the State Open Meetings Law Compliance Board determines that a violation of the Open Meetings Act has occurred; repealing a prohibition on the introduction of opinions issued by the Board as evidence in specified proceedings; and increasing the penalties for violations of the Open Meetings Act.

Prohibiting a person from selling or offering to sell essential goods and services during a state of emergency for a price of more than 15% above the price charged by that person for those goods and services a specified time prior to the state of emergency; prohibiting a person from selling or offering to sell repair or reconstruction services or services used for emergency cleanup for a price of more than 15% above the price charged by that person for those services immediately prior to the state of emergency; creating specified exceptions; etc.

Requiring the Secretary of Human Resources to establish the Couples Advancing Together Pilot Program in the Department of Human Resources; requiring the Program to be established for 100 couples in at least three counties in the State; requiring the Secretary to cooperate with specified persons on the establishment of the Program; requiring the implementation of specified policies and procedures in local departments of social services; establishing eligibility standards for the Program created by the Act; etc.

Authorizing the City of Baltimore to exempt specified real estate development projects that provide job opportunities and involve private investment of less than specified amounts and are located outside of a specified urban renewal area from Baltimore City real property tax if the owner of the project and Baltimore City enter into a specified payment in lieu of taxes agreement; defining a term; etc.
