SENATE BILLS INTRODUCED February 3, 2015

SB 224 Senator Reilly

EDUCATION – MAINTENANCE OF EFFORT – LEASE PAYMENT EXCLUSION

Authorizing specified county governing bodies to exclude specified lease payments made by a county board of education from the maintenance of effort calculation under specified circumstances; and providing for the application of the Act.

SB 225 Senator Reilly

HIGHER EDUCATION – UNACCOMPANIED HOMELESS YOUTH TUITION EXEMPTION – MODIFICATION

Altering the definition of unaccompanied homeless youth by requiring a determination of homelessness by a specified individual or specified documentation; and requiring a financial aid administrator to annually make a specified verification.

ANNE ARUNDEL COUNTY – PROPERTY TAX CREDIT – BLIND INDIVIDUALS AND SURVIVING SPOUSES

Authorizing Anne Arundel County and a municipal corporation in Anne Arundel County to grant, by law, a property tax credit against the county and municipal corporation property tax imposed on specified residential property owned by specified blind individuals or surviving spouses of blind individuals; requiring that a property tax credit authorized by the Act shall be granted in addition to any property tax exemption authorized by law, except under specified circumstances; etc.

CREATION OF A STATE DEBT – ANNE ARUNDEL COUNTY – THE ARC OF THE CENTRAL CHESAPEAKE REGION

Authorizing the creation of a State Debt not to exceed \$300,000, the proceeds to be used as a grant to the Board of Directors of The Arc of the Central Chesapeake Region, Inc. for the acquisition, planning, design, construction, repair, renovation, reconstruction, and capital equipping of The Arc of the Central Chesapeake Region Donald Avenue building, located in Anne Arundel County; providing for disbursement of the loan proceeds, subject to a requirement that the grantee provide and expend a matching fund; etc. EFFECTIVE JUNE 1, 2015 Assigned to: Budget and Taxation

SB 228 Senator King, et al

SUPPLEMENTAL PUBLIC SCHOOL CONSTRUCTION MATCHING FUND PROGRAM

Establishing the Supplemental Public School Construction Matching Fund Program; providing for the purpose of the Program and requiring the Department of Budget and Management to implement and administer the Program; establishing specified requirements a county must meet to be eligible for the Program; requiring the Department to provide to each county that is eligible for the Program up to \$20,000,000 of State funding each fiscal year to be used to fund the cost of public school construction projects; etc.

This bill requires a mandated appropriation in the annual budget bill.

SB 229 Calvert County Senators

CALVERT COUNTY – SALE OR DISTRIBUTION OF TOBACCO AND RELATED PRODUCTS – CIVIL PENALTIES

Prohibiting a person who owns and operates a specified business in Calvert County that engages in the retail sale of tobacco products from storing or displaying a tobacco product in a specified manner; prohibiting a person in Calvert County from distributing a tobacco product to a minor except under specified circumstances, distributing cigarette rolling papers to a minor, or distributing to a minor a coupon redeemable for a tobacco product except under specified circumstances; etc.

SB 230 Calvert County Senators

CALVERT COUNTY – LENGTH OF SERVICE AWARD PROGRAM – RECIPIENT BENEFITS

Altering the age from 55 to 50 years old at which specified individuals may begin to receive benefits under the Length of Service Award Program for Calvert County; altering from \$4 to \$10 per month an additional amount that is payable under the Program for specified volunteer service; repealing a limit on a maximum benefit payable under the Program; authorizing a specified death benefit to be paid to an alternate beneficiary if a volunteer dies and is unmarried at the time of death; etc.

SB 231 Calvert County Senators

CALVERT COUNTY – ALCOHOLIC BEVERAGES – SPECIAL BEER AND WINE FESTIVAL LICENSE

Altering the scope and title of the special wine festival license in Calvert County; authorizing the Board of License Commissioners of Calvert County to issue a special beer and wine festival license to the holders of specified alcoholic beverages licenses or to a not–for–profit organization; authorizing the holder of the license to display and sell beer or wine for consumption on or off the licensed premises on specified days and for specified hours; authorizing the Board to approve up to four weekends for an applicant; etc.

Authorizing Anne Arundel County to enact a local law that authorizes secondary employment of county police officers. EFFECTIVE OCTOBER 1, 2015 GP, § 5-811.1 - added Reassigned to: Education, Health, and Environmental Affairs
