HOUSE BILLS INTRODUCED FEBRUARY 13, 2017

HB 1523 Delegate Lierman, et al

CREATION OF A STATE DEBT – BALTIMORE CITY – BALTIMORE REGIONAL EDUCATION AND TRAINING CENTER

Authorizing the creation of a State Debt not to exceed \$1,000,000, the proceeds to be used as a grant to the Board of Directors of CASA de Maryland, Inc. for the acquisition, planning, design, construction, repair, renovation, reconstruction, site improvement, and capital equipping of the Baltimore Regional Education and Training Center, located in Baltimore City; providing for disbursement of the loan proceeds, subject to a requirement that the grantee provide and expend a matching fund; etc.

CREATION OF A STATE DEBT – PRINCE GEORGE'S COUNTY – TUCKER ROAD ICE RINK

Authorizing the creation of a State Debt not to exceed \$350,000, the proceeds to be used as a grant to the Maryland–National Capital Park and Planning Commission for the acquisition, planning, design, construction, repair, renovation, reconstruction, site improvement, and capital equipping of the Tucker Road Ice Rink, located in Prince George's County; providing for disbursement of the loan proceeds, subject to a requirement that the grantee provide and expend a matching fund; etc.

HB 1525 Delegate J. Lewis, et al**CRIMINAL PROCEDURE – VICTIM NOTIFICATION –
DISSEMINATION AND NATIONAL STANDARDS**

Altering a definition of “disseminate” to exclude providing information to victims of crime or their representatives; altering the purposes of specified provisions of law relating to the Criminal Justice Information System; and requiring the Department of Information Technology to conduct a study relating to interfaces used for automated victim notification and to report its findings and recommendations to the Governor and the General Assembly on or before December 31, 2017.

HB 1526 Delegates Angel and Vallario**CRIMINAL PROCEDURE – POSTSENTENCING – VICTIM
NOTIFICATION**

Expanding the types of crimes for which a victim may receive specified notification regarding a specified offender’s mandatory supervision, parole, commutation of sentence, pardon, or remission of sentence; expanding the types of crimes for which a victim may submit a specified impact statement to the Parole Commission or the Division of Parole and Probation; etc.

HOUSE BILL REASSIGNED FEBRUARY 10, 2017**HB 1167 Delegate Wivell, et al****UNBORN CHILD PROTECTION FROM DISMEMBERMENT ABORTION
ACT OF 2017**

Prohibiting, except under specified circumstances, the performance of or the attempt to perform a dismemberment abortion that kills an unborn child on a pregnant woman; authorizing a specified individual to seek a hearing before the State Board of Physicians on a specified issue; providing that specified findings of the Board from a specified hearing are admissible on that issue at a specified trial; providing for the delay of a specified trial for a specified purpose for a specified number of days; etc.
