SENATE BILLS INTRODUCED March 1, 2017

SB 1162 Senator Benson

CREATION OF A STATE DEBT – PRINCE GEORGE’S COUNTY – CAPITOL HEIGHTS MUNICIPAL MULTISERVICE CENTER

Authorizing the creation of a State Debt not to exceed \$350,000, the proceeds to be used as a grant to the Mayor and Town Council of the Town of Capitol Heights for the acquisition, planning, design, construction, repair, renovation, reconstruction, site improvement, and capital equipping of the Capitol Heights Municipal Multiservice Center, located in Prince George’s County; providing for disbursement of the loan proceeds, subject to a requirement that the grantee provide and expend a matching fund; etc.

MOTOR VEHICLES – DUPLICATE DRIVERS’ LICENSES – VICTIMS OF ROBBERY

Authorizing a victim of a robbery whose driver’s license is taken during the robbery to drive without a license for 2 weeks under specified circumstances; requiring the Motor Vehicle Administration, when processing an application for a duplicate license of a victim of a robbery, to process the victim’s application on an expedited basis and give the application precedence over other applications for duplicate licenses under specified circumstances; etc.

MARYLAND TRANSPORTATION AUTHORITY – MEMBERSHIP

Altering the membership of the Maryland Transportation Authority to include specified members of the General Assembly as nonvoting members of the Authority serving in an advisory capacity only; specifying criteria concerning the appointment, tenure, and compensation of the legislative members of the Authority; etc.

MARYLAND LONGITUDINAL DATA SYSTEM – STUDENT AND WORKFORCE DATA LINKAGE – EXTENSION OF TIME LIMIT

Extending from 5 years to 20 years the length of time that student data and workforce data used by the Maryland Longitudinal Data System is limited to being linked beyond the date of latest attendance in any educational institution in the State.
