## **SENATE BILLS INTRODUCED January 17, 2017**

**SB 159**    **Senator Waugh**

**SALES AND USE TAX – AIRCRAFT PARTS AND EQUIPMENT – EXEMPTION**

Providing an exemption from the sales and use tax for materials, parts, or equipment used to repair, maintain, or upgrade aircraft or the avionics systems of aircraft if the materials, parts, or equipment are installed on the aircraft.

**SB 160 Senator Waugh****HANDGUN PERMITS – MULTIJURISDICTIONAL RECOGNITION**

Specifying that a permit to carry a handgun issued to an individual in Delaware, Pennsylvania, Virginia, Washington, D.C., or West Virginia is valid in Maryland.

**SB 161 Senator Waugh****TRANSPORTATION – HIGHWAY USER REVENUES – ALLOCATION**

Increasing the portion of highway user revenues that is distributed to local governments if the Transportation Trust Fund revenue for a fiscal year exceeds the most recent estimate of the Board of Revenue Estimates for that fiscal year; altering the allocation of the local share of highway user revenues among Baltimore City, counties, and municipalities; etc.

**SB 162 Senator Waugh****ST. MARY’S COUNTY – MOBILE HOME PARKS – REPEAL**

Repealing specified provisions of law that relate to the licensing and operation of mobile home parks in St. Mary’s County.

**SB 163 Senator Waugh****ST. MARY’S COUNTY – ELECTRICIANS AND BOARD OF ELECTRICAL EXAMINERS – REPEAL**

Repealing specified provisions of law that relate to the Board of Electrical Examiners and the licensing and regulation of electricians in St. Mary’s County.

**SB 164**     **Senators Brochin and Salling****BALTIMORE COUNTY – ETHICS – PROHIBITIONS AND REQUIREMENTS REGARDING PAYMENTS DURING PENDENCY OF ZONING APPLICATIONS**

Prohibiting applicants, agents of applicants, and immediate family members of the applicants and agents from making a payment to a member or the County Executive of Baltimore County or a specified slate during the pendency of the application; prohibiting a member from voting or participating in any way in the proceeding on an application under specified circumstances; requiring the applicant to file a specified affidavit under oath after the application is filed; etc.

**SB 165**     **The President (By Request – Department of Legislative Services – Code Revision)****CODE REVISION – MARYLAND VEHICLE LAW – PENALTIES**

Revising, restating, and recodifying the laws of this State relating to penalties for violations of the Maryland Vehicle Law; repealing specified redundant provisions; clarifying language; making specified technical and stylistic changes; providing for the construction of the Act; providing for the effect and construction of specified provisions of the Act; and authorizing the publisher of the Annotated Code to make specified corrections in a specified manner.
