HOUSE BILLS INTRODUCED MARCH 1, 2018

HB 1783 Delegate Jones

21ST CENTURY SCHOOL FACILITIES ACT

Altering the requirements for awarding contracts to bidders for school buildings; requiring the Interagency Committee on School Construction to conduct a certain facility assessment; specifying the process for the review and approval of public school construction projects; establishing the Local Share of School Construction Costs Revolving Loan Fund to provide loans to local governments to forward fund the local share of school construction costs; declaring the intent of the General Assembly regarding funding for school construction; etc.

LIFE INSURANCE – SALE BY TELEPHONE

Providing that an insurance producer that sells a policy of life insurance solely by telephone is deemed to be in compliance with a certain requirement if the life insurer issuing the policy sends a notice via first-class mail within 7 days of the sale and notifies the insured that the insured may surrender the policy within 30 days, the face amount of the policy does not exceed \$100,000, a certain license number was disclosed during the call, and the life insurer maintains a certain recording for a certain period of time; etc.

COSMETOLOGISTS – LICENSING EXAMINATION – REQUIREMENTS

Decreasing from 1,380 to 1,200 the number of hours of cosmetology school that a certain applicant for a cosmetology license must complete before the applicant may take a certain written examination; requiring cosmetology schools to administer a certain part of an examination to certain students; and requiring the State Board of Cosmetologists to adopt regulations to require cosmetology schools to administer a certain part of an examination and to provide the opportunity for certain remedial training to certain students.

HB 1786 Delegate Jackson, et al

HIGHER EDUCATION – RICHARD W. COLLINS III LEADERSHIP WITH HONOR SCHOLARSHIP – ESTABLISHMENT

Establishing the Richard W. Collins III Leadership With Honor Scholarship Program; establishing eligibility criteria for the scholarship that requires an individual to be a member of the Reserve Officer Training Corps, a certain minority student, and a student at a historically black college or university; requiring the Office of Student Financial Assistance in the Maryland Higher Education Commission to award 25% of its grant money to students at Bowie State University and 75% to certain other colleges and universities; etc.

This bill requires a mandated appropriation in the annual budget bill.
