SB 534 Howard County Senators

CREATION OF A STATE DEBT – HOWARD COUNTY – HARRIET TUBMAN COMMUNITY CENTER AND MUSEUM HO. CO. 4–18

Authorizing the creation of a State Debt not to exceed \$500,000, the proceeds to be used as a grant to the County Executive and County Council of Howard County for the acquisition, planning, design, construction, repair, renovation, reconstruction, site improvement, and capital equipping of the Harriet Tubman Community Center and Museum, located in Howard County; providing for disbursement of the loan proceeds, subject to a requirement that the grantee provide and expend a matching fund; etc.

CREATION OF A STATE DEBT – HOWARD COUNTY – LISBON VOLUNTEER FIRE DEPARTMENT HO. CO. 5–18

Authorizing the creation of a State Debt not to exceed \$250,000, the proceeds to be used as a grant to the Board of Directors of the Lisbon Volunteer Fire Company, Inc. for the acquisition, planning, design, construction, repair, renovation, reconstruction, site improvement, and capital equipping of a new building for the Lisbon Volunteer Fire Department, located in Howard County; providing for disbursement of the loan proceeds, subject to a requirement that the grantee provide and expend a matching fund; etc.

Authorizing the creation of a State Debt not to exceed \$150,000, the proceeds to be used as a grant to the County Executive and County Council of Howard County for the acquisition, planning, design, construction, repair, renovation, reconstruction, site improvement, and capital equipping of the Barnard Fort House, located in Howard County; providing for disbursement of the loan proceeds, subject to a requirement that the grantee provide and expend a matching fund; etc.

Authorizing the creation of a State Debt not to exceed \$150,000, the proceeds to be used as a grant to the County Executive and County Council of Howard County for the acquisition, planning, design, construction, repair, renovation, reconstruction, site improvement, and capital equipping of the Ellicott City Baltimore and Ohio Railroad Station Museum, located in Howard County; providing for disbursement of the loan proceeds, subject to a requirement that the grantee provide and expend a matching fund; etc.

CORPORATE INCOME TAX - THROWBACK RULE

Requiring that certain sales of tangible personal property be attributed to the State for apportionment purposes under the corporate income tax if the corporation is not taxable in the state of the purchaser; applying the Act to taxable years beginning after December 31, 2017; etc.

CORRECTIONAL SERVICES – RESTRICTIVE HOUSING – LIMITATIONS

Authorizing a certain sanction for a certain inmate who has been found guilty of a certain administrative infraction; authorizing a certain sanction for a certain inmate who has been found guilty of a certain substantive infraction; restricting to 15 consecutive days or a total of 90 days that an inmate may be placed in restrictive housing in a 1—year period; prohibiting a certain vulnerable inmate from placement in restrictive housing under certain circumstances; etc.

GARRETT COUNTY - BIDS AND CONTRACTS

Increasing from \$15,000 to \$25,000 the threshold amount of a certain contract of sale or purchase entered into by the County Commissioners of Garrett County or a county employee above which the county is required to advertise for bids.

Authorizing the creation of a State Debt not to exceed \$250,000, the proceeds to be used as a grant to the Board of Directors of The Glenn L. Martin Maryland Aviation Museum, Inc. for the acquisition, planning, design, construction, repair, renovation, reconstruction, site improvement, and capital equipping of The Glenn L. Martin Maryland Aviation Museum, located in Baltimore County; providing for disbursement of the loan proceeds, subject to a requirement that the grantee provide and expend a matching fund; etc.

CARROLL COUNTY – VOLUNTEER FIRE, RESCUE, AND EMERGENCY MEDICAL SERVICES

Authorizing the County Commissioners of Carroll County to distribute certain funds to rescue and emergency medical services companies in addition to fire companies, subject to a certain plan; authorizing the County Commissioners to award certain service award payments to members of rescue and emergency medical services companies in addition to fire companies; requiring the County Commissioners under certain circumstances to establish an Emergency Services Advisory Council for certain purposes; etc.

LABOR AND EMPLOYMENT – PAYMENT OF THE MINIMUM WAGE REQUIRED (FIGHT FOR FIFTEEN)

Specifying the State minimum wage rate that is in effect for certain time periods; increasing, except under certain circumstances, the State minimum wage rate based on the annual growth in the Consumer Price Index for All Urban Consumers for the Washington–Baltimore metropolitan area; specifying the tip credit amount that is in effect for certain time periods; prohibiting an employer, beginning July 1, 2026, from including the tip credit amount as part of the wage of certain employees; etc.

HEALTH OCCUPATIONS – ADVANCED PRACTICE DENTAL HYGIENE

Requiring the State Board of Dental Examiners to adopt regulations for the licensure of advanced practice dental hygienists and the practice of advanced practice dental hygiene; requiring the Board to adopt regulations establishing criteria for taking certain actions relating to a delegation agreement; requiring the Board to adopt a code of ethics for the practice of advanced practice dental hygiene; requiring the Board to set certain fees and to pay all fees collected to the Comptroller; etc.

PUBLIC SAFETY – MARYLAND VIOLENCE INTERVENTION AND PREVENTION PROGRAM FUND – ESTABLISHMENT

Establishing the Maryland Violence Intervention and Prevention Program Fund to provide funds to local governments to implement evidence—based or evidence—informed health programs and to evaluate the efficacy of evidence—based and evidence—informed health programs; requiring the Governor to annually appropriate at least \$5,000,000 to the Fund; establishing the Maryland Violence Intervention and Prevention Advisory Council; etc.

This bill requires a mandated appropriation in the annual budget bill.

HIGHER EDUCATION – TUITION RATES – EXEMPTIONS

Altering the circumstances under which certain individuals are exempt from paying the out—of—state tuition rate at public institutions of higher education; altering the circumstances under which certain individuals are eligible to pay the resident tuition rate at a public senior higher education institution or the in—county rate at a community college; requiring certain individuals to remain exempt from paying certain tuition rates until the individual is awarded a certain degree under certain circumstances; etc.

ELECTION LAW – ELECTIONS BY MAIL

Requiring that elections be conducted by mail; requiring the State Board of Elections, in consultation with the local boards of elections, to select a certain voting system; requiring the State Board to adopt certain regulations; requiring local boards of elections to mail a ballot to certain voters by certain deadlines; authorizing certain voters to request that a local board provide a ballot to the voter; requiring a voter who receives a ballot to return the marked ballot by mail or to certain drop sites; etc.

EDUCATION – STUDENTS WITH READING DIFFICULTIES – SCREENINGS AND INTERVENTIONS

Requiring certain county boards of education to ensure that a certain student is screened to identify if the student is at risk for reading difficulties beginning with the 2019–2020 school year; requiring a county board to use certain screening instruments for certain students; requiring a county board to monitor a certain student for progress for up to 8 weeks; requiring certain county boards to report annually certain information to the State Department of Education; etc.

HEALTH OCCUPATIONS – PHYSICIAN ASSISTANTS – DISPENSING OF DRUGS UNDER A DELEGATION AGREEMENT

Altering the required contents of a certain delegation agreement in order for a primary supervising physician to delegate to a certain physician assistant the dispensing of certain substances, drugs, and devices; prohibiting a primary supervising physician from delegating the dispensing of certain controlled dangerous substances identified as Schedule I; authorizing a physician assistant, under certain circumstances, to personally prepare and dispense a drug that the assistant is authorized to prescribe; etc.

Authorizing money and assets in an ABLE account to be transferred, on the death of a designated beneficiary, to a certain estate or a certain ABLE account for an eligible individual, unless prohibited by federal law; and prohibiting the State, unless required by federal law, from seeking payment from an ABLE account or its proceeds for certain medical benefits paid for the designated beneficiary.

VEHICLE LAWS – BUS LANE MONITORING CAMERAS – AUTHORIZATION

Prohibiting a person from driving a motor vehicle in a dedicated bus lane unless authorized by a certain local jurisdiction, subject to certain exceptions; prohibiting the use of a bus lane monitoring camera in a local jurisdiction unless authorized by the governing body by local law enacted after reasonable notice and a public hearing; requiring a local jurisdiction, before using a bus lane monitoring camera, to publish notice of the use of the bus lane monitoring camera in a certain manner; etc.

STATE BOARD OF PROFESSIONAL COUNSELORS AND THERAPISTS – SUNSET EXTENSION AND PROGRAM EVALUATION

Continuing the State Board of Professional Counselors and Therapists in accordance with the provisions of the Maryland Program Evaluation Act (Sunset Law) by extending to July 1, 2021, the termination provisions relating to statutory and regulatory authority of the Board; altering the composition of the Board; repealing certain provisions of law establishing and governing the Behavior Analyst Advisory Committee; establishing the Alcohol and Drug Counselor Subcommittee; etc.

STATE GOVERNMENT – SECURITY TRAINING – PROTECTION OF SECURITY–SENSITIVE DATA

Altering the aspects of State information technology that are to be included in the statewide information technology master plan developed and maintained by the Secretary of Information Technology; requiring the Secretary to develop, maintain, and revise certain security training material; requiring each unit of State government to develop a plan to identify certain employees and establish certain security training for each employee who handles security—sensitive data as part of the employee's duties; etc.

Altering the definition of "State personnel" to include a person acting on behalf of the State in accordance with State law for the purposes of establishing certain immunity against tort claims; and applying the Act prospectively.

Reducing the notice period from 14 days to 7 days before a landlord may file an action to evict a tenant for a breach of the lease that involves certain dangerous behavior; reducing from 10 days to 4 days the amount of time after entry of a certain judgment during which a certain party may appeal to the circuit court in an eviction proceeding based on a breach of the lease that involves certain dangerous behavior; etc.

Increasing the generating capacity limit for an electric generating system used by an eligible customer–generator for net metering and a community solar energy generating system under certain circumstances; requiring an electric generating system used by an eligible customer–generator for net metering and a community solar energy generating system to comply with local land use and planning laws; etc.

Authorizing the creation of a State Debt not to exceed \$380,000, the proceeds to be used as a grant to the Board of Directors of the Penn–Mar Organization, Inc. for the acquisition, planning, design, construction, repair, renovation, reconstruction, site improvement, and capital equipping of the Penn–Mar Human Services Day Learning Center, located in Baltimore County; providing for disbursement of the loan proceeds, subject to a requirement that the grantee provide and expend a matching fund; etc.

Altering the date from September 15 to November 15 by which an individual or a corporation is required to submit a certain application for a certain credit against the State income tax for certain research and development expenses incurred by the individual or corporation; altering the date from December 15 to February 15 by which the Department of Commerce shall certify the credits approved for the individual or corporation; altering the method by which the individual or corporation may claim the credit; etc.

Altering a certain date to January 1, 2020, by which the State is required to discontinue a certain prescription drug benefit for certain retirees; authorizing certain retirees who participate in a certain prescription drug benefit plan with a certain dependent to elect to have the dependent covered under a certain State prescription drug benefit plan; requiring the Secretary of Budget and Management to provide a certain notice to certain retirees of certain changes not later July 1, 2019; etc.

Requiring a vision screening provided to certain students in public schools to include the administration of a screening for possible symptoms of certain vision disorders; requiring screenings to be given in certain years to certain students unless evidence is presented that the student has been tested by certain doctors or screened for the symptoms of certain vision disorders; etc.

Authorizing employees on a public work contract to sue to recover the difference between certain prevailing wage rates and the amounts received by the employees; providing that a certain determination by the Commissioner of Labor and Industry does not preclude certain employees from filing a certain action; requiring a court to order the payment of certain damages under certain circumstances; and providing for the liability of certain contractors and subcontractors under certain circumstances.

Authorizing a certain defendant convicted of a nonviolent crime to make a motion for the court to consider the defendant's status as a certain primary caretaker; and requiring the court to make a certain determination and consider placing a certain defendant on probation with certain conditions under certain circumstances.
