Community Colleges - Contraception - Access Requirements

3 FOR the purpose of requiring, on or before a certain date dates, each community college to develop and implement a plan to provide students with access to over-the-counter 4 5 contraception; requiring each community college to submit a certain report to the 6 Maryland Higher Education Commission each year; requiring the Commission to 7 submit a certain report to the General Assembly each year; authorizing the Maryland Department of Health, on request, to provide certain assistance to a 8 9 community college; and generally relating to community colleges and contraception 10 access requirements.

- 16 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND,

AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That the Maryland Higher Education Commission shall ensure that the focus of the report due to the General Assembly on or before September October 1, 2025, under § 16–111 of the Education Article as enacted by Section 1 of this Act, shall be on the implementation plans of community colleges that have not implemented the institution's access to over—the—counter contraception on or before October August 1, 2025.
