10 11	(c) (1) The regulations adopted under subsection (b) of this section shall require:
12 13	(i) a recommendation from a practicing veterinary practitioner in the State who has employed the veterinary assistant for at least 2 years;
14 15	(ii) appropriate assessment, including a passing score on the Veterinary Technician National Exam; and
16 17 18	(iii) appropriate training and experience, as indicated by a credential from a state government or an organization recognized by the National Association of Veterinary Technicians in America to issue the credential.
19 20	(2) The regulations may not require a full veterinary technician program but may require a limited number of credits as determined necessary by the Board.
21 22	(d) The alternative pathway established under this section shall be available for employed veterinary assistants only until September 30, 2027, inclusive.
23 24	SECTION 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect October 1, 2024.
