11	SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND,

(a) The Attorney General or any Deputy Attorney General or assistant AttorneyGeneral whom the Attorney General designates may:

16 (1) become a member of an organization of attorneys general of other states 17 or their deputies or assistants and, as provided in the State budget, contribute to the 18 expenses of the organization; and

19 (2) use the services of the Council of State Governments and, as provided 20 in the State budget, contribute to the cost of the services.

(b) (1) On January 1 of each year, the Attorney General shall submit an
annual report to the Governor AND, IN ACCORDANCE WITH § 2–1257 OF THIS ARTICLE,
THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY.

(i) describe the business and proceedings of the Office during the
 preceding calendar year; AND

31 (c) The Attorney General shall keep the following records until they are disposed 32 of in accordance with § 10–616 of this article:

1 (1) a copy of the pleadings in each suit, action, or other proceeding of which 2 the Office has charge;

3 a complete and current docket of those proceedings; (2)(3)a copy of each written opinion that the Office issues; and 4  $\mathbf{5}$ (4) an abstract of each title that the Office examines or has examined. 6 (d) The Attorney General annually shall [have published, in bound volume] 7PUBLISH ON THE WEBSITE OF THE ATTORNEY GENERAL: 8 (1)the opinions that the Office issued during the preceding calendar year; 9 and 10 the annual report for that preceding calendar year. (2)11 (e) The papers of the Office shall be filed in its offices until disposed of in (1)accordance with § 10-616 of this article. 1213The papers and books of the Office shall be indexed so that they are (2)14readily accessible.
