## A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning

## 2 Education - Public School Stadium Grant Program and Study - Established

- 3 FOR the purpose of establishing the Public School Stadium Grant Program; requiring the 4 Interagency Commission on School Construction to implement and administer the 5 Program; requiring the Interagency Commission on School Construction to conduct 6 a comprehensive study analyzing the current condition of public high school athletic 7 and physical education facilities in the State; requiring the Prince George's County 8 Board of Education and the Maryland-National Capital Park and Planning 9 Commission, on or before a certain date, to meet to discuss potential partnerships to 10 upgrade public high school athletic and physical education facilities; and generally 11 relating to the Public School Stadium Grant Program and public high school athletic and physical education facilities in the State. 12

- 18 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND,
- 19 That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:
- 20 Article Education
- 21 **5–330.**
- 22 (A) IN THIS SECTION, "PROGRAM" MEANS THE PUBLIC SCHOOL STADIUM 23 GRANT PROGRAM.

EXPLANATION: CAPITALS INDICATE MATTER ADDED TO EXISTING LAW.

- 1 (B) (1) THERE IS A PUBLIC SCHOOL STADIUM GRANT PROGRAM.
- 2 (2) THE PURPOSE OF THE PROGRAM IS TO PROVIDE GRANTS TO
- 3 COUNTY BOARDS FOR MAJOR RENOVATION OR REPLACEMENT OF STADIUMS FOR
- 4 PUBLIC HIGH SCHOOLS.
- 5 (C) THE PROGRAM SHALL BE IMPLEMENTED AND ADMINISTERED BY THE
- 6 Interagency Commission.
- 7 (D) (1) THE INTERAGENCY COMMISSION SHALL:
- 8 (I) PROVIDE GRANTS TO COUNTY BOARDS FOR STADIUM
- 9 IMPROVEMENTS;
- 10 (II) DEVELOP A PROCEDURE FOR A COUNTY BOARD TO APPLY
- 11 FOR A GRANT UNDER THE PROGRAM; AND
- 12 (III) DEVELOP ELIGIBILITY REQUIREMENTS FOR A COUNTY
- 13 BOARD TO RECEIVE A GRANT UNDER THE PROGRAM.
- 14 (2) THE INTERAGENCY COMMISSION MAY NOT:
- 15 (I) AWARD GRANTS TO COUNTY BOARDS FOR ROUTINE
- 16 MAINTENANCE ON PUBLIC HIGH SCHOOL STADIUMS UNDER THE PROGRAM; OR
- 17 (II) REQUIRE A PROJECT TO COMPLY WITH THE STATE AND
- 18 LOCAL COST-SHARE ESTABLISHED FOR EACH COUNTY IN REGULATIONS.
- 19 (E) (1) BEGINNING IN FISCAL YEAR 2026, THE GOVERNOR SHALL
- 20 INCLUDE IN THE ANNUAL OPERATING OR CAPITAL BUDGET BILL AN APPROPRIATION
- 21 OF \$60,000,000 FOR THE PROGRAM.
- 22 (2) THE STATE FUNDING PROVIDED UNDER THE PROGRAM IS
- 23 SUPPLEMENTAL TO AND IS NOT INTENDED TO TAKE THE PLACE OF FUNDING THAT
- 24 WOULD OTHERWISE BE APPROPRIATED FOR PUBLIC SCHOOL CONSTRUCTION
- 25 PURPOSES TO A COUNTY BOARD FROM ANY OTHER SOURCE.
- 26 (F) THE INTERAGENCY COMMISSION MAY ADOPT REGULATIONS
- 27 NECESSARY TO IMPLEMENT THIS SECTION.
- SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That:
- 29 (a) (1) The Interagency Commission on School Construction shall conduct a
- 30 comprehensive study analyzing the current condition of public high school athletic and

- 1 physical education facilities in the State.
- 2 (2) The Interagency Commission on School Construction may hire an 3 independent consultant to conduct the study.
- 4 (3) In conducting the study, the Interagency Commission on School 5 Construction shall consult with each county board of education.
- 6 (b) The study shall include:
- 7 (1) subject to subsection (c) of this section, an analysis of public high school 8 athletic and physical education facilities in the State, including information for each public 9 high school on:
- 10 (i) the last time the athletic and physical education facilities were 11 upgraded;
- 12 (ii) whether a partial or full replacement of the athletic and physical education facilities is needed;
- 14 (iii) the estimated cost of a partial or full replacement of the athletic 15 and physical education facilities; and
- 16 (iv) the overall quality of the athletic and physical education 17 facilities;
- 18 (2) the average cost for public high school athletic and physical education 19 facility replacements;
- 20 (3) the total financial need by county for athletic and physical education 21 facility replacements;
- 22 (4) recommendations on best practices for replacing athletic and physical 23 education facilities; and
- 24 (5) an audit of any related needs assessments that have already been 25 conducted by a county or county board.
- 26 (c) A county board shall provide the information required under subsection (b)(1) of this section on request from the Interagency Commission on School Construction.
- 28 (d) On or before December 1, 2024, the Interagency Commission on School 29 Construction shall submit a report of its findings and recommendations to the Governor 30 and, in accordance with § 2–1257 of the State Government Article, the General Assembly.
- SECTION 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That on or before December 1, 2024, the Prince George's County Board of Education and the Maryland–National Capital

- Park and Planning Commission shall meet to discuss potential partnerships to upgrade public high school athletic and physical education facilities in Prince George's County.
- 3 SECTION 4. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect June 4 1, 2024. Section 2 of this Act shall remain effective for a period of 1 year and, at the end of
- 5 May 31, 2025, Section 2 of this Act, with no further action required by the General
- 6 Assembly, shall be abrogated and of no further force and effect.
