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Baltimore City - Alcoholic Beverages - Board of License Commissioners

- 3 FOR the purpose of requiring the Governor, rather than the Mayor and the President of 4 the City Council of Baltimore City, to appoint the members of the Board of License 5 Commissioners for Baltimore City with the advice and consent of the Senate; 6 authorizing the Governor, rather than the Mayor and the President of the City 7 Council of Baltimore City, to remove a member of the Board for certain infractions; 8 requiring certain members of the Board to be residents of the City or to have served 9 in the City government for a certain period of time immediately preceding their 10 appointment; clarifying that the Board and employees of the Board must comply with 11 State ethics requirements, rather than Baltimore City ethics requirements; and 12 generally relating to the Board of License Commissioners for Baltimore City.



13 14 15	(ii) if the Senate is not in session, by the [Mayor or President of the City Council] GOVERNOR ALONE , subject to the advice and consent of the Senate when the Senate next convenes.
