Washington Requested: October 23, 2023 Introduced and read first time: January 10, 2024 Assigned to: Budget and Taxation Committee Report: Favorable with amendments Senate action: Adopted Read second time: February 25, 2024 CHAPTER AN ACT concerning State Procurement - Maryland Correctional Enterprises Preferred Provider Requirements - Waiver FOR the purpose of requiring the Department of General Services authorizing the Pricing and Selection Committee for Preferred Providers to grant a waiver from a certain requirement to use a certain preferred provider for the procurement of supplies and services under certain circumstances; requiring the Committee to review a certain request for a certain waiver to the State or a State-aided or controlled entity under certain circumstances; requiring Maryland Correctional Enterprises to provide certain information on the delivery of supplies and services in an annual report; and generally relating to procurements from preferred providers. BY repealing and reenacting, with amendments, Article – State Finance and Procurement Section 14–103, 14–106, and 14–110(d) Annotated Code of Maryland (2021 Replacement Volume and 2023 Supplement) SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows: Article - State Finance and Procurement
