BY repealing and reenacting, without amendments, Article – Natural Resources Section 4-11A-10(c) and (c-1)Annotated Code of Maryland (2023 Replacement Volume and 2023 Supplement) BY repealing and reenacting, with amendments, Chapter 238 of the Acts of the General Assembly of 2019 Section 3 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows: Article - Natural Resources
