4 FOR the purpose of ~~requiring a licensed health care provider, when issuing a standing order~~
5 ~~for an opioid reversal drug, to allow an individual to choose any formulation of any~~
6 ~~opioid reversal drug approved by the federal Food and Drug Administration;~~
7 requiring the Maryland Department of Health, on or before certain dates, to report
8 to certain committees of the General Assembly on opioid overdose reversal drugs and
9 standing orders; and generally relating to reports on standing orders ~~for~~ and opioid

21 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND,
22 That ~~the Laws of Maryland read as follows:~~ on or before December 1, 2024, December 1,

1 2025, and December 1, 2026, the Maryland Department of Health shall report to the Senate
 2 Finance Committee and the House Health and Government Operations Committee, in
 3 accordance with § 2-1257 of the State Government Article, on:

4 (1) current opioid overdose reversal drugs approved by the federal Food
 5 and Drug Administration; and

6 (2) for any current opioid overdose reversal drug approved by the federal
 7 Food and Drug Administration, whether the Department has added the drug to a standing
 8 order, and if not, the reasons why the drug has not been added.

 3 of opioid overdose reversal drugs approved by the federal Food and Drug Administration to
 4 an employee or a volunteer of an authorized private or public entity in accordance with a
 5 written agreement under § 13-3104 of this subtitle.

6 ~~[(3)] (4)~~ Any licensed health care provider who has dispensing authority
 7 also may dispense an opioid overdose reversal drug approved by the federal Food and Drug
 8 Administration to any individual in accordance with a standing order issued by a licensed
 9 health care provider with prescribing authority in accordance with this subsection.

10 ~~(e)~~ A pharmacist may dispense opioid overdose reversal drugs approved by the
 11 federal Food and Drug Administration in accordance with a therapy management contract
 12 under Title 12, Subtitle 6A of the Health Occupations Article.

13 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect
 14 October 1, 2024.
