AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall be construed to 15 apply only prospectively and may not be applied or interpreted to have any effect on or 16 application to the program administrator of the Next Generation Scholars of Maryland 17 Program for the fiscal year 2025 grant cycle.

18 SECTION 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect 19 October 1, 2024.
