SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, That: There is a Task Force to Study Public Information Act Requests Made to Law (a) Enforcement. (b) The Task Force consists of the following members: (1) two members of the Senate of Maryland, appointed by the President of the Senate: (2) two members of the House of Delegates, appointed by the Speaker of the House: the Attorney General, or the Attorney General's designee; (3) **(4)** the Secretary of State Police, or the Secretary's designee;

19 20	(2) is entitled to reimbursement for expenses under the Standard State Travel Regulations, as provided in the State budget.
21 22	(f) A member of the Task Force serves at the pleasure of the person who appointed the member.
23 24	(g) At the first meeting of the Task Force, the Task Force shall vote to adopt a code of conduct providing for the acceptable conduct of Task Force members.
25	(h) The Task Force shall review and study:
26 27	(1) costs charged by law enforcement agencies in relation to disclosure of records requested under the Maryland Public Information Act;
28 29	(2) procedures applied by law enforcement agencies in the disclosure of records requested under the Maryland Public Information Act; and

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(3) the status and operations of the Maryland Public Information Act Compliance Board.
$\frac{\text{(g)}}{\text{(i)}}$ (1) On or before December 31, 2024, the Task Force shall submit an interim report on its findings, in accordance with § 2–1257 of the State Government Article, to the General Assembly.
(2) On or before December 31, 2025, the Task Force shall submit a final report on its findings, in accordance with $\S 2-1257$ of the State Government Article, to the General Assembly.
SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect July 1, 2024. It shall remain effective for a period of 2 years and, at the end of June 30, 2026, this Act, with no further action required by the General Assembly, shall be abrogated and of no further force and effect.
