1 AN ACT concerning

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Hospitals and Related Institutions – Outpatient Facility Fees

- FOR the purpose of altering the definition of "hospital" to require a hospital located outside
 the State that provides outpatient services to patients in the State to provide a
 certain written notice regarding outpatient facility fees under certain circumstances;
 altering the required contents of the written notice regarding outpatient facility fees;
 requiring the Maryland Health Services Cost Review Commission, in consultation
 with certain entities, to study and make recommendations regarding hospital
 outpatient facility fees; and generally relating to hospital outpatient facility fees.

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- 1 (ii) Except as provided in paragraph (3) of this subsection, the 2 written notice required under subsection (b) of this section shall be sent to the patient 3 electronically at the time the appointment is made.
- 4 (2) For an appointment made electronically or using a website, the written notice required under subsection (b) of this section shall be:
- 6 (i) Provided at the time the appointment is made; and
- 7 (ii) Sent to the patient electronically at the time the appointment is 8 made.
- 9 (3) If the patient refuses electronic communication under paragraph (1)(ii) 10 of this subsection, the written notice shall be sent to the patient by first-class mail at the 11 time the appointment is made.
- 12 (f) Before professional medical services are provided on the date of the 13 appointment, the patient shall acknowledge in writing that the notice required under this 14 section was provided at the time the appointment was made.
- 15 (g) A hospital may not charge, bill, or attempt to collect an outpatient facility fee 16 unless the patient was given notice in accordance with this section.
- 17 (h) (1) On or before January 31 each year, beginning in 2022, each hospital shall report to the Health Services Cost Review Commission a list of the hospital–based, 19 rate–regulated outpatient services provided by the hospital.
- 20 (2) On or before February 28 each year, beginning in 2022, the Health 21 Services Cost Review Commission annually shall:
- 22 (i) Post on its website the list of the hospital-based, rate-regulated 23 outpatient services reported by each hospital under paragraph (1) of this subsection; and
- 24 (ii) Provide the list of the hospital-based, rate-regulated outpatient 25 services reported by each hospital to the Maryland Insurance Administration and the 26 Health Education and Advocacy Unit in the Office of the Attorney General.
- 27 (3) When lack of notice in accordance with this section is alleged in a consumer complaint, the Commission shall give consideration in its investigatory and audit procedures as to whether notice was not feasible due to circumstances beyond the hospital's control.
