Senate Bill 646 (Senators Carter and McCray)  
Education, Energy, and the Environment

---

**General Provisions – Commemorative Days – Hip Hop Day of Service**

---

This bill requires the Governor to annually proclaim November 18 as Hip Hop Day of Service. The proclamation must urge citizens and organizations to observe Hip Hop Day of Service with appropriate programs, ceremonies, and activities.

---

**Fiscal Summary**

**State Effect:** None. Commemorating Hip Hop Day of Service does not affect State finances.

**Local Effect:** None.

**Small Business Effect:** None.

**Analysis**

**Current Law:** Nineteen official commemorative days, seven months, and one week are recognized in State law, as shown in **Exhibit 1**. The Governor also must issue a proclamation each year encouraging citizens and other individuals to observe a moment of silence at 3:00 p.m. on Memorial Day to unite in remembrance and commemorate the heroic acts and efforts of Marylanders who have served and died in the U.S. Armed Forces.
