## FISCAL AND POLICY NOTE Third Reader

Senate Bill 69 (Anne Arundel County Senators)

Education, Energy, and the Environment

**Appropriations** 

### Anne Arundel County - Board of Community College Trustees - Membership Alterations and Appointment Requirements

This bill adds two new members to the Board of Community College Trustees for Anne Arundel County. Additionally, the bill requires that, to the extent practicable, the Governor must take into consideration the geographic and ethnic representation of Anne Arundel County when appointing members to the board so that all segments of the population of the county are represented on the board. Notwithstanding the date of appointment of the initial additional members, the terms of the initial additional members must begin on July 1, 2024. **The bill takes effect July 1, 2024.** 

### **Fiscal Summary**

**State Effect:** None. The bill is directed at Anne Arundel Community College (AACC).

**Local Effect:** AACC expenditures to onboard and provide reimbursement to new board members are minimal and likely absorbable with existing resources. Revenues are not affected.

**Small Business Effect:** None.

### **Analysis**

**Current Law:** The Board of Community College Trustees for Anne Arundel County consists of eight members, appointed by the Governor, with the advice and consent of the Senate. Except the student member, members of the Board of Community College Trustees for Anne Arundel County serve four-year terms. A member may not serve more than three consecutive full terms. The student member serves a one-year term beginning

July 1 and ending June 30. A member appointed to fill a vacancy in an unexpired term serves only for the remainder of that term and until a successor is appointed and qualifies.

State law generally establishes that community college boards have seven members serving staggered six-year terms, with several specified exceptions. Therefore, there are variations in the number and terms of board members. **Appendix 1** shows characteristics of the various boards. With one exception, the boards are appointed by the Governor with the advice and consent of the Maryland Senate. For Chesapeake College, the board is appointed by the Governor with the advice and consent of the Maryland House of Delegates.

**Local Expenditures:** AACC advises that the college's expenditures increase beginning in fiscal 2025 for (1) onboarding of new board members (a one-time cost of \$1,500); (2) annual travel reimbursements (up to \$3,000 per trustee annually); and (3) access to board software (\$400 per trustee annually). However, it is assumed that these costs are likely absorbable.

<sup>&</sup>lt;sup>12</sup>A local nominating committee must submit to the Governor the names of two to four candidates per vacancy, from which the Governor must appoint a new member.
