## A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning

## 2 Driver's Education - Laboratory and Classroom Instruction - Required Hours

3 FOR the purpose of altering the number of hours of laboratory instruction in a driver's

- 4 education course that an individual who is under a certain age must complete before
- 5 the individual qualifies for a driver's license, subject to certain exemptions; altering
- 6 the number of hours of classroom instruction required to be offered by certain
- 7 drivers' education programs; making stylistic changes; and generallyrelating to
- 8 requirements regarding the number of hours of laboratory and classroom
- 9 instruction in driver's education programs.

10 BY repealing and reenacting, with amendments,

# 15 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF

16 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

## 17 Article - Transportation

18 16-103.

19 (b) (1) Except as provided under paragraph (3) of this subsection, the

- 20 Administration may issue a noncommercial Class B, C, or M license to an individual
- 21 under the age of 18, if [he] THE INDIVIDUAL is at least 16 years old and has completed
- 22 satisfactorily a driver's education course approved under Subtitle 5 of this title, and has
- 23 completed satisfactorily [6] 10 hours of laboratory instruction.

24 (2) The individual shall be exempt from the laboratory instruction required25 by this subsection, though not the required classroom instruction, if:

26 (i) [He] THE INDIVIDUAL has been licensed regularly to drive in27 another state for at least 6 months; and

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1 (ii) [He] THE INDIVIDUAL establishes to the satisfaction of a 2 classroom instructor certified under Subtitle 5 of this title that [his] THE INDIVIDUAL'S 3 driving experience is sufficient to justify the exemption. 4 16-506. 5 (a) Subject to the prior endorsement of the regulations by the State 6 Superintendent of Schools, the Administration shall adopt and enforce regulations not 7 inconsistent with this subtitle to implement driver education programs conducted by 8 licensed drivers' schools under its jurisdiction. 9 (b) Regulations adopted under this section shall be administered by the 10 Administration and shall include: 11 (1) Curriculum, equipment, and facility standards for both classroom and 12 laboratory phases; 13 (2) Minimum student performance standards for successful completion of 14 an approved driver education program, consisting of at least [30] 20 hours of classroom 15 instruction; 16 (3) Standards for the certification of schools, classroom instructors, and 17 laboratory instructors; (4) A system to evaluate the effectiveness of the driver education program; 18 19 (5) Standards governing the required offering of the driver education 20 program, based on the capacity, enrollment, staff, and facilities of the schools; and 21 (6) Standards for the eligibility of individuals to enroll in the program. 22 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect 23 October 1, 1996.

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
