- 3 FOR the purpose of prohibiting a person from stopping, standing, or parking on a loading
- 4 zone designed for the use of individuals with disabilities; requiring parking lots
- 5 constructed or altered after a certain date to conform to requirements of the
- 6 Maryland Accessibility Code; repealing certain nonconforming provisions relating
- 7 to minimum parking spaces, size, and sign requirements; making stylistic changes;

- 14 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF
- 15 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

- 18 (ee) A person may not stop, stand, or park a vehicle in front of OR ON a passenger
- 19 loading zone designed or marked for the use of individuals with disabilities.

- 21 (a) [In this section, "parking lot" means any parking lot reserved for the use of
- 22 persons entering a retail store or shopping center that has more than 20,000 square feet
- 23 of usable floor area, except a parking lot built in compliance with the Maryland Building
- 24 Code for the handicapped.
- 25 (b) Except as otherwise mandated by federal law, each parking lot shall designate
- 26 parking spaces for the use of individuals with disabilities as follows:
