2 Vehicle Laws - Individuals with Disabilities - Parking

3 FOR the purpose of prohibiting a person from stopping, standing, or parking on a loading

- 4 zone designed for the use of individuals with disabilities; requiring parking lots
- 5 constructed or altered after a certain date to conform to requirements of the
- 6 Maryland Accessibility Code; repealing certain nonconforming provisions relating
- 7 to minimum parking spaces, size, and sign requirements; making stylistic changes;
- 8 and generally relating to parking for individuals with disabilities.

9 BY repealing and reenacting, with amendments,

14 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF

15 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

- 16 Article Transportation
- 17 21-1003.

(ee) A person may not stop, stand, or park a vehicle in front of OR ON a passengerloading zone designed or marked for the use of individuals with disabilities.

21 (a) [In this section, "parking lot" means any parking lot reserved for the use of 22 persons entering a retail store or shopping center that has more than 20,000 square feet

EACH PARKING LOT THAT IS CONSTRUCTED OR ALTERED AFTER OCTOBER 1, 1996 SHALL CONFORM WITH THE REQUIREMENTS OF THE MARYLAND ACCESSIBILITY CODE ADOPTED UNDER ARTICLE 83B, § 6-102 OF THE CODE.

22 [(c) Each space reserved for individuals with disabilities under subsection (b) 23 shall:

24 (1) Be at least 12 feet wide;

(2) Be located to provide individuals with disabilities with easy accessibility26 to the store or shopping center.

(d) Each space reserved for a person with a disability shall be signified by a signthat complies with the Maryland Building Code for the handicapped.

(e)] (B) A person may not park a motor vehicle in a space designated for the use
of individuals with disabilities unless the vehicle bears a special registration plate, a
removable windshield placard, or a temporary removable windshield placard issued by the
Administration under § 13-616, § 13-616.1, or § 13-616.2 of this article or similarly by
another state, the District of Columbia, or another country.

(a) The owner or lessor of a supermarket, business establishment, orshopping
area or center that has entrances surrounded by obstacles designed to prevent shopping
carts from being removed from the premises, shall provide an unobstructed entrance
during business hours for [physically handicapped persons] INDIVIDUALS WITH
DISABILITIES, as provided for in subsection (b) OF THIS SECTION.

1 (b) Such an entrance shall be at least 36 inches wide and constructed to allow 2 reasonable access for entry and egress for [physically handicapped persons confined to 3 wheelchairs] INDIVIDUALS WITH DISABILITIES.

4 (c) Failure to provide such an entrance, or failure to keep it unlocked and 5 accessible during business hours to [physically handicapped persons confined to a 6 wheelchair] INDIVIDUALS WITH DISABILITIES, is a violation of this article.

7 (d) Nothing contained in this section shall be construed as negatingthe provisions
8 of the Maryland [Building] ACCESSIBILITY Code for the handicapped and aged
9 [promulgated] ADOPTED under Article 83B, § 6-102 of the Code.

10 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect 11 October 1, 1996.
