28	[(10)] (4) The right of a school psychologist, who is certified by the Board to practice school psychology consistent with the provisions of that certification, may not be limited by Title 18 of the Health Occupations Article with respect to the practice of school psychology in an educational institution.

33 34	EXCEPT FOR A REQUIREMENT FOR A TEACHER CERTIFICATION TEST, THE STATE SUPERINTENDENT HAS THE AUTHORITY TO WAIVE SPECIFIC REQUIREMENTS FOR A CERTIFICATE IN AN INDIVIDUAL CASE, IF THE STATE SUPERINTENDENT DETERMINES, AFTER THOROUGH INVESTIGATION, THAT THE APPLICANT'S PREPARATION OR EXPERTISE, OR BOTH, ARE ADEQUATE TO JUSTIFY A WAIVER.
