### A BILL ENTITLED

## 1 AN ACT concerning

# 2 Election Laws - Polling Places - Electioneering

3 FOR the purpose of repealing certain provisions that prohibit certain electioneering

- 4 activity within a certain radius of a polling place in certain subdivisions of the State;
- 5 and generally relating to illegal electioneering at polling places.

6 BY repealing and reenacting, with amendments,

- 7 Article 33 Election Code
- 8 Section 24-23(a)
- 9 Annotated Code of Maryland
- 10 (1993 Replacement Volume and 1995 Supplement)

11 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF

12 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

13 Article 33 - Election Code

14 24-23.

(a) The following offenses shall be punished as in this section provided. For anyperson:

(1) Wilfully to destroy or deface any ballot or, except as provided in thisarticle, to take or remove any ballot outside of the building in which voting occurs, beforethe close of the polls; or

20 (2) Wilfully to delay the delivery of any ballot; or

(3) On or before the day of any election to have or retain in his possession
any official ballot printed for said election unless such possession byhim is necessary or
appropriate and designed for the purpose of carrying out the true intent and meaning of
this article; or

(4) [(i)] To canvass, electioneer or post any campaign materialin the
polling place or beyond a line established by signs posted in accordance with this
paragraph. At each polling place, 2 election judges, 1 from each principal political party,
shall be designated by the election board and, acting jointly, shall post signs outlining a

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1 line around the entrance and exit of the building closest to that part of the building in

2 which voting occurs. The line shall be located as near as practicable to 100 feet from the 3 entrance and exit and shall be established after consideration of the configuration of the

4 entrance and the effect of placement on public safety and the flow of pedestrian and

5 vehicular traffic. The signs shall contain the following or comparable language: "No

6 Electioneering Beyond this Point".

[(ii) In Anne Arundel, Cecil, Charles, Garrett, Harford, Kent, and
Queen Anne's Counties, to canvass, electioneer, or post any campaign literature or
material on election day in a polling place or within a 300 foot radiusfrom the entrance
and exit of the building closest to that part of the building in which voting occurs.]

SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect
 October 1, 1996.

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
