SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

10	which voting occurs. The line shall be located as near as practicable to 100 feet from the
11	entrance and exit and shall be established after consideration of the configuration of the
12	entrance and the effect of placement on public safety and the flow of pedestrian and
13	vehicular traffic. The signs shall contain the following or comparable language: "No
14	Electioneering Beyond this Point".
15	[(ii) In Anne Arundel, Cecil, Charles, Garrett, Harford, Kent, and
16	Queen Anne's Counties, to canvass, electioneer, or post any campaign literature or
17	material on election day in a polling place or within a 300 foot radius from the entrance

18 and exit of the building closest to that part of the building in which voting occurs.]
