18	SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF	
19	MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

- (a) To qualify for a license, an applicant shall satisfy the Bank Commissioner that 22 23 the applicant:
- (1) Is trustworthy and reputable; 24
- (2) Has a good business reputation; 25
- (3) Has sufficient business experience; 26
- (4) Will keep at all times the permissible investments requiredunder §
- 28 12-414 of this subtitle; and

- 1 (b) Has a net worth of at least \$100,000, computed according to generally 2 accepted accounting principles.
- 3 (C) IN CONNECTION WITH AN INITIAL APPLICATION AND AT ANY OTHER
- 4 TIME AT THE REQUEST OF THE BANK COMMISSIONER, THE DEPARTMENT OF LABOR,
- 5 LICENSING, AND REGULATION SHALL REQUIRE A SET OF FINGERPRINTS TO BE
- 6 TAKEN OF EACH APPLICANT FOR OR HOLDER OF A LICENSE TO SELL MONEY
- 7 ORDERS OR TRAVELER'S CHECKS FOR FEDERAL AND STATE CRIMINAL HISTORY
- 8 RECORD CHECKS TO BE CONDUCTED BY THE FEDERAL BUREAU OF INVESTIGATION
- 9 OR THE CRIMINAL JUSTICE INFORMATION SYSTEM CENTRAL REPOSITORY OF THE
- 10 DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC SAFETY AND CORRECTIONAL SERVICES.
- 11 (D) ANY APPLICANT OR LICENSE HOLDER REQUIRED BY THIS SECTION TO BE
- 12 FINGERPRINTED SHALL PAY ANY PROCESSING FEE REQUIRED BY THE FEDERAL
- 13 BUREAU OF INVESTIGATION OR THE CRIMINAL JUSTICE INFORMATION SYSTEM
- 14 CENTRAL REPOSITORY OF THE DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC SAFETY AND
- 15 CORRECTIONAL SERVICES.
- 16 (E) IF THE APPLICANT OR LICENSE HOLDER IS A CORPORATION, THE
- 17 FINGERPRINTING AND CRIMINAL HISTORY RECORD CHECK REQUIREMENTS SHALL
- 18 APPLY TO THE PRESIDENT AND TO ANY OTHER OFFICER OF THE CORPORATION
- 19 DESIGNATED BY THE BANK COMMISSIONER.
- 20 (F) THE REQUIREMENT FOR FINGERPRINTING AND CRIMINAL HISTORY
- 21 RECORD CHECKS SHALL NOT APPLY TO ANY CORPORATION THE SECURITIES OF
- 22 WHICH ARE EXEMPT FROM REGISTRATION UNDER § 11-601(8) OR (12) OF THE
- 23 CORPORATIONS AND ASSOCIATIONS ARTICLE.
- 24 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED. That this Act shall take effect
- 25 October 1, 1996.
