A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning

2 **District Court - Coordinator of Commissioner Activity**

3 FOR the purpose of authorizing the Chief Judge of the District Court to appoint a
4 coordinator of commissioner activity; providing for the personnel classification and
5 compensation of the coordinator of commissioner activity; and generally relating to
6 the coordinator of commissioner activity of the District Court.

12 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF
13 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

14 **Article - Courts and Judicial Proceedings**

15 2-601.

16 (a) There shall be a chief clerk of the District Court, [4] FOUR assistant chief
17 clerks, a supervising auditor, A COORDINATOR OF COMMISSIONER ACTIVITY, a chief
18 administrative clerk in each district, a clerk in each county, and other clerical and
19 administrative employees necessary to conduct the business of the court.

20 (b) Except as provided in § 2-602 of this subtitle or otherwise by law, the clerical,
21 administrative, and constabular employees of the District Court shall be appointed by the
22 Chief Judge of the District Court on the recommendation of the administrative judge for
23 the district and shall be in the classified service of the State Personnel Management
24 System.

26 (a) The chief clerk, the assistant chief clerks, [and] the supervising auditor, AND
27 THE COORDINATOR OF COMMISSIONER ACTIVITY are appointed by and serve at the
28 pleasure of the Chief Judge of the District Court.

1 (b) A chief administrative clerk is appointed by the Chief Judge of the District
2 Court, upon the recommendation of the administrative judge of the district and serves at
3 the pleasure of the Chief Judge of the District Court.

4 (c) The chief clerk, the assistant chief clerks, the supervising auditor, THE
5 COORDINATOR OF COMMISSIONER ACTIVITY, and the chief administrative clerks of
6 the districts shall be in the personnel system of the judicial branch, subject to the
7 classification authority of the Chief Judge of the Court of Appeals, and shall receive the
8 compensation prescribed by the General Assembly.

9 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect
10 October 1, 1996.
