A BILL ENTITLED

3 FOR the purpose of requiring certain health insurers to provide coverage for certain

- 5 detect bone loss for the prevention, diagnosis, and treatment of osteoporosis;
- 6 requiring certain health insurers to identify and use certain materials for certain

- 8 generally relating to requiring certain health insurers to provide certain coverage for
- 9 certain individuals for a certain procedure used to identify bone mass or detect bone
- 10 loss for the prevention, diagnosis, and treatment of osteoporosis.

WHEREAS, 25 million Americans are stricken with osteoporosis - a preventabledisorder that occurs most frequently among older people, causing loss of bone mass; and

19 WHEREAS, Experts estimate that, in the United States, one in two women and one 20 in five men will suffer a bone fracture because of osteoporosis; and

WHEREAS, Nationally, osteoporosis results in 1.5 million fractures of the hip,
spine, wrist, and other bones, with a cost of at least \$18 million in heath care and
associated expenses; and

WHEREAS, Osteoporosis progresses silently and in most cases goes undiagnosed until a fracture occurs; once a fracture occurs, the disease is alreadyadvanced, and the likelihood is high that another fracture will occur; and

WHEREAS, Because osteoporosis progresses silently and currently has no cure,
prevention, early diagnosis, and treatment are key to reducing the prevalence and
devastation of this disease; and

WHEREAS, Medical experts agree that osteoporosis is preventable and treatable,
 however, once the disease progresses to the point of fracture its associated consequences
 often lead to disability and institutionalization, and exact a heavy toll on quality of life;
 and

5 WHEREAS, Given the current national focus on health care reform and reducing
6 unnecessary health care expenditures through the use of health promotion/disease
7 prevention programs, mandating coverage of services, such as bone mass measurement,
8 related to prevention, early diagnosis, and timely treatment of osteoporosis is a
9 cost-effective approach for states to embrace; and

WHEREAS, Bone mass measurement is a reliable way to detect the presence of low
bone mass and to ascertain the extent of bone loss to help assess an individual's risk for
fracture, and this aids in selecting appropriate therapies and interventions; and

WHEREAS, Ordinary X-rays are not sensitive enough to detect osteoporosis until25% to 40% of bone mass has been lost and the disease is far advanced; and

WHEREAS, Currently available technologies for bone mass measurement include:
single- and dual-photon absorptiometry, single- and dual-energy X-ray absorptiometry,
quantitative computed tomography, and radiographic absorptiometry; and

18 WHEREAS, Other technologies for measuring bone mass are under investigation19 and may become scientifically proven technologies in the future; and

WHEREAS, Scientifically proven technologies for bone mass measurement and other services related to the prevention, diagnosis, and treatment of osteoporosis can be used effectively to reduce the pain and financial burden that osteoporosis inflicts upon its victims; now, therefore,
